












In a town not unlike Hollywood, in a city not unlike LA, on the west coast of a country not unlike the USA resides the legend they call Jerry Spoonberg.

Jerry Spoonberg


When it comes to making movies no one knows more that Jerry Spoonberg. As he once famously said "No one knows more about making movies than me."



Thus his identity was sealed.







Todd is Jerry's Head of Production, his second in command, his eyes and ears.







Ryan actually ended up in the family pool house, which is kind of like leaving home without giving up the room service.









Waldo Spoonberg

The Big Picture




